Sarangi and suka, two of the world's most ancient musical instruments, will blend to create a soulful fusion in the city. The Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) in collaboration with Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), is presenting an Indo-Polish Fusion Music event titled *When Masters Meet*. World-renowned sarangi maestro Ustad Kamal Sabri will collaborate with Polish artiste Prof Maria Pomirowska, who travelled to India to learn Indian classical music years ago and later reconstructed the long-forgotten Polish musical instrument suka. Very similar to sarangi, suka has not existed on the Polish music palette for the last 100 years. The unique
